Dear Parent/Carer,

Last week, I came into school and delivered sessions about online safety.

For Key Stage 1, this was about telling a trusted adult if you feel worried about something you have done or seen whilst on the internet.

Years 3 and 4 have covered online safety rules and explored why it is important that they think about age restrictions for downloading apps and playing video games.

Years 5 and 6 have looked at the way in which predators can target them online by creating false profiles. This relates to children sharing content via apps such as Instagram and TikTok and the session looked at issues related to doing live streams and creating profiles without parents knowing about these accounts.

In order to help parents, there is a video I have put together about some of the issues facing children when they are online. You can access it via using your smart device (phone, tablet) and scanning the QR code with your camera. When you access the video, you need to enter the password: ESOOLDC28922
